outdoors. Cliff was appreciated and loved his southern friends.

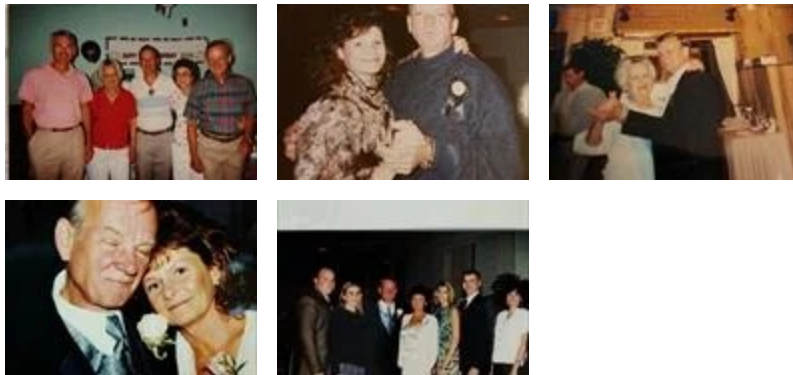
A celebration of his life will be held at a later date.

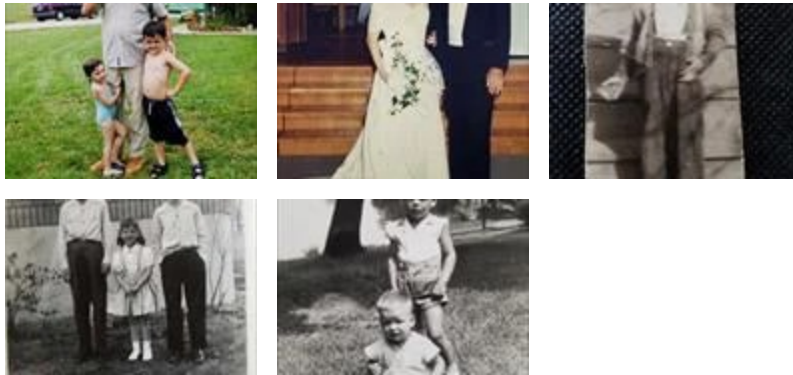
