Elizabeth Jones Yeatts of Lynchburg, departed this world peacefully the morning of Wednesday, July 11, 2012 at Lynchburg General Hospital. She was born October 23, 1914 in Lynchburg and was the oldest daughter of the late Carrie Smith Jones and William Stratton Jones. Most of her life was spent in Altavista, married to Arnett L.
