She retired as lead finisher for Branner Woodworks, Baltimore, MD. Her volunteer work included Keyser Rescue Squad, various ASPCA functions, Peoples Homesteading Group where she also served in various board positions for more than 10 years, Baltimore Zoo Docent working with spiders, reptiles and snakes, Baltimore Pit Rescue where she advocated for all bully breeds, and several Baltimore Feral Cat organizations where she performed TNR duties, rehab and rehoming, and also built shelters. She enjoyed volunteering her time to help the lives of animals and humans alike.
