Loleta Wallace Short, 86, of Gretna, died Thursday, May 7, 2026, at Runk & Pratt Pearls of Life in Lynchburg. She was the wife of the late Ray Morris Short.

She was born June 29, 1939, in Roanoke, a daughter of the late John Henry Wallace and Ruth Elizabeth Keckler Wallace. Loleta was a faithful member of First Church of Christ, Scientist, Lynchburg and belonged to the Women of the Moose Chapter in Altavista and was a member of the Beta Sigma Phi Sorority. She graduated from Jefferson High School and Radford University. Loleta enjoyed fishing and sewing and devoted many years to education before retiring from Campbell County Public Schools as a teacher.

She is survived by one son, Jeff Short of Myrtle Beach, SC; two sisters, Wanda Hancock and her husband, Richard, of Roanoke, and Norma Wallace Christiansen of Orlando, FL; and nieces and nephews, Kim Hammond, Tim Wolf, Blake Wolfe, Blair Wolfe, Eric Hancock, and Jim Hancock.

A memorial service will be conducted at 2:00 p.m. Friday, May 15, 2026, at Finch & Finch Chapel, Altavista, by former Army Chaplain, Jeffrey Plum, with inurnment to follow at Green Lawn Cemetery in Hurt.

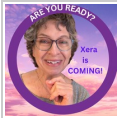
