



## Lorice Greenway

February 6, 1917 - July 11, 2012

Lorice Daniel Greenway, 95, of Altavista died Wednesday, July 11, 2012 at Autumn Care of Altavista. She was married to the late Jasper Allen Greenway for sixty-seven years. Mrs. Greenway was born February 6, 1917 on a farm in Bedford County, to the late Thomas Griffin Daniel and Lula Monteria Witt Daniel. Mrs. Greenway was strong in support of her beliefs and loved rural America. At one point during World War II, she had four brothers in combat, one a POW for three years, and one killed in action on the Island of Iwo Jima. Three returned home to Bedford County and lived in Central Virginia. Mrs. Greenway was one of the early members of Central Baptist Church of Altavista, retaining her membership for almost eighty years. She spent forty-seven years in public work, first with Burlington Industries and then worked for twenty-five years (without a lost day) for Campbell County Schools as Cafeteria Manager at Altavista High School. She is survived by one daughter, Doris Hicks of Altavista; one son, Talmadge Greenway and his wife Tyra of Lynchburg; five grandchildren, Rusty Hicks and his wife Beth, Ginny Perkins and her husband Chip, Keith Hicks and his wife Paula, Tracy Greenway, and Timothy Greenway and his fiancée Whitney Claiborne; five great grandchildren, Bryan Hicks, Elliott Perkins, Stephen Perkins, Daniel Hicks, and Evan Hicks; and one brother, Floyd Daniel and his wife Mildred. She was preceded in death by four brothers, Gerald, Willie, Herbert, and Howard Daniel; and a sister, Arlene Daniel Agner. Mrs. Greenway was a wife, mother, daughter, friend, sister, teacher, worker, and strong supporter of her

community. She was a true Christian, an open and honest believer that Jesus is the Son of God. She lived a life that set an example for the values and standards for which we should all strive. The following poem is a tribute to Mrs. Greenway from her family.

Thou art even as a flower is,  
So gentle and pure and fair;
