Stanley Martin White, Jr., 90, of Hurt, Va. died Sunday, December 29, 2013 at Lynchburg General Hospital. He was the husband of the late Lillian Geraldine "Gerri" White for forty-nine years.

He was born October 26, 1923 in Huntington, W.V., the son of the late Stanley Martin White, Sr. and Pearl Evelyn Gibson White.

Stan graduated Marshall College (BS, 1946) and West Virginia University (MS, 1949). His working career included Allied Chemical Corp. as a Senior Research Scientist, Burlington Industries as a Senior Research Chemist, and a Professor of Chemistry at Ohio State University.

He enjoyed photography since the age of 18, and was a member of the Photographic Society of America. Stan also studied oil painting, watercolor and was an active member of the Seven Hill Art Club. One of his most pleasurable activities was time spent at the Altavista YMCA, which allowed many years of good physical health and numerous dear friends with whom he took many trips.

Survivors include one son, Dr. Jan A. Harbour and his wife Linda of Huntington, W.V.; one daughter, Diana Harbour-Ehlich and her husband Scott of Forest, Va.; four granddaughters, Dr. Amy Garmestani and her husband

Adrian, Aly McGinnis and her husband Ben, Andrea Gardner and her husband Eddy, Kristen Harbour and eight great grandchildren. Also surviving are two nieces, Sherri Riggs and Carol Riggs; and one nephew Gary Ashworth.

In addition to his wife and parents, he was preceded in death by one brother and four sisters.

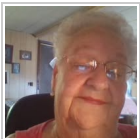

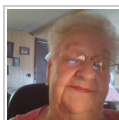
